Currently, the group meets the second Tuesday of each month at Vista Grande from 9:45-11:00 (except during the summer months). Speakers from all over come to talk about issues regarding gardening, water, tree health, landscaping, etc. The garden club has also created and maintained the remembrance garden which is located at Vista Grande, just east of the baseball fields and near the dog park. The club has also adopted three different highway sections to clean up every six months.
